

PEANUTS AS A ROTATIONAL CROP



Rotational cropping is the practice of alternating crops in the same plot of land to improve soil health and prevent pests.



BENEFITS

- Peanuts do well in dryland environments.
- Peanuts are nitrogen-fixing legumes so they restore soil health.
- Rotating with cotton reduces pests and weeds for both crops.
- Cotton yield increases when rotated with peanuts due to peanuts' low nutrient demand, allowing the soil health/fertility to regenerate between crops.
